2016 AGM Chairmans address – 9th March 2016, Lackham

Welcome to the 60th Annual Western Branch AGM and my second as branch Chairman.

Firstly, as I've already mentioned, our Branch Secretary, Glen Craig, was not able to attend tonight due to ill health so I wanted to record here that we all wish him a speedy recovery.

It was only when I started writing this in early Feb that I realised it was the 60th AGM and kicked myself that we hadn't made more of an effort to celebrate our "Diamond Jubilee". Hopefully the tea, coffee and sandwiches outside will serve as some form of party food but I cant promise any other form of entertainment apart from two interesting talks yet to come.

Certainly, the fact that we retired the old meeting record book in the Spring of last year dating back to 1963 showed a rich history of meetings and visits. This now resides in the care of Richard Robinson at Autoguide in Heddington.

I wanted to summarise the branch activities in the past year since the 2015 AGM at Cirencester. This is the second time I've said this but I like to think we are one of the more active Branches which is due to the support of the Committee, Branch Members, our industry connections and our academic institutions who we rely on to host our meetings. At a recent branch event it was commented to me that Western Branch appeared to have a much fuller calendar than a certain neighbouring branch – positive feedback like this is always welcome.

4th March 2015 AGM – The year was started with our well attended AGM at Cirencester at which the Presidential address was given by Dr Paul Miller, Honary Fellow of NIAB and Silsoe Spray Solutions, past IAgreE President and also Secretary of the Douglas Bomford Trust. This was followed by presentation entitled "From Cloud To River" by Fred Clark on his company Mastenbroek and their range of trenching and drainage equipment with a particular focus on the latest GPS surveying and trencher control techniques. Many thanks go to Nigel Anstee for arranging this due to his connections with the company which was a follow up from a branch visit to Mastenbroek in Boston, Lincolnshire a few years previously.

Comittee mtg – held on 20th May 2015 @ Autoguide Equipment where we discussed 2015/16 programme. Do please let us know if you have a suggestion either in a meeting or by email. The programme is not just down to the committee, we always welcome suggestions from all members. Although as the "Institute of Agricultural Engineers" I believe we should aim to ensure our focus is on current and future technology and practices and not



to spend too much of our time visiting museums and looking back on what we did "back then".

The 2015/16 season started again at Lackham on the 30th September with a presentation by Richard Danby on his life and times at RDS Ltd. Richard, a farmers son and Silsoe graduate, spent many years at RDS from an apprentice in the technical service department working his way up to Managing Director before retirement in 2013. RDS are well known for their grain loss monitoring systems for combines and also electronic sprayer and drill control systems. Today it employs 95 people from its Nailsworth HQ and is a division of Topcon – a Japanese-American leader in precision farming systems.

The plan was to then follow this on the 11th November by a visit to Woodlands Farm at Chedworth in Gloucestershire to view their Dairy and on-site Ice Cream and Yogurt business but being mid November the influence of Agritechnica and other commitments meant this had to be postponed and, at the time of writing, we are looking to re-arrange this visit for the Spring/Summer 2016. Information will be sent out in due course.

27th Jan 2016 – Andover Trailers visit – ten Western Branch members attended this visit in Andover Trailers main facility. The visit was arranged by Nick Handy with Leonard Fuller, once MD of Taskers who's history of making trailers near Andover goes back to the early 1800's. Leonard was one of the original founders of Andover Trailers in 1985. A company presentation was given showing various applications and specialist rigid body and articulated trailer designs along with information on Goldhofer heavy/large load transportation solutions made in Germany for whom Andover Trailers are UK distributors for. This was followed by a tour of the assembly and fabrication shops and it was very interesting to see the design and fabrication techniques used. Thanks go to both Nick for arranging the visit and to Leonard for his time and hospitality.

On 17th February around 8 members and guests were treated to a tour of the Wadworths Brewery in Devizes kindly organised by Richard Robinson. As Agricultural Engineers we should always be aware of the eventual uses of the arable crops we design and build machinery for so this in depth look at the processing of Barley and Hops was a good example of that! Our guide Dec was an excellent host taking us through the whole process from the milling of the malted barley, mash tuns, original Victorian & modern boilers and the fermentation room. This was then followed by a tour of the famous sign works, dray horse stables and the inevitable sampling of the product. Thanks go to Richard and Mandy Dunn at Autoguide for arranging this visit.

Shortly I will hand over to Alastair Taylor (IAgrE Chief Executive) who has very kindly come this evening to present the 2016 Presidential Address with all the latest news of the Institution and the good work it is doing. After that and a short break we will hand over to David Lester of MAN UK who will present a lecture on remote telemetry systems.

Lastly I'd like to thank you all, committee, representatives of Institute HQ and other gathered members and guests for your support in the last year and for attending this AGM.
