## Frederick Lanchester Interactive Archive

Frederick Lanchester besides being one of the great pioneers of the automotive industry is perhaps best known for designing and building the first all-British motor car in 1895 but he also published papers and books detailing the first scientific principles of flight, and theorised about the principles of colour photography before it was reality, and devised military strategies that underpin business management courses still taught today. Visit the archive to see, and bring to life, his collected sketchbooks, notebooks and correspondence. The exhibition, and online archive, will enable examination of his many patents (over 400) and automotive blueprints, which together celebrate and validate Lanchester's place at the heart of British engineering, and ensure he truly lives up to his description as "Britain's own Leonardo da Vinci."
