



You must be a member of a Professional Engineering Institution (such as the IAgRE) before you can apply for Professional Registration.

Ask IAgRE or check if your degree is accredited on the Engineering Council Website at <https://www.engc.org.uk/education-skills/course-search/accredited-course-search/>

Seek advice from IAgRE as to the best way forward

Undertake Further Learning

Career Learning Assessment (CLA)

Submit CV, CLA Forms and certificate copies to IAgRE for review

Attend a CLA Assessment Interview

Submit your evidence for review. This should show how you meet the requirements of the UK Standard for Professional Engineering Competence (UK-SPEC) at the chosen level of Incorporated or Chartered Engineer

This will be sent to two assessors for review

If your submission meets the UK-SPEC you will be invited for a PRI

If your PRI is successful, you will be put forward for final review by IAgRE

Congratulations! Your name will be put forward to Engineering Council for Registration
